THE CONCEPT OF JUNGLE BULLIES

JUNGLE BULLIES ARE TYPICALLY DEFINED AS INDIVIDUALS WITHIN A SPECIES THAT EXHIBIT AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIORS TOWARDS OTHERS, OFTEN TO ESTABLISH DOMINANCE OR SECURE RESOURCES SUCH AS FOOD, TERRITORY, OR MATES. THIS BEHAVIOR CAN MANIFEST IN VARIOUS WAYS, INCLUDING PHYSICAL CONFRONTATIONS, VOCALIZATIONS, OR DISPLAYS OF STRENGTH. THE TERM ENCAPSULATES A RANGE OF INTERACTIONS AMONG DIFFERENT SPECIES, SHOWCASING NATURE'S RAW HIERARCHY.
